The Alaska Seafood Processing Leadership Institute is a program designed to identify and foster individuals who are up and coming leaders in the seafood processing industry. Successful applicants will reside in a community adversely impacted by the downturn of the Alaska salmon industry and have successfully worked in seafood processing.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply with a mentor, which might be someone from a processing plant or a regional non-profit organization, a person who can provide professional guidance throughout the institute; and a sponsor who can support the required contribution of \$2,500. *Limited scholarships are available.*
